The Current State of Evictions in NYS

- Most Tenants cannot be evicted before May 1, 2021
- Moratorium may apply if Tenant:
 - Suffered loss of income during pandemic
 - Experienced increased work or health related expenses due to the pandemic
 - Experienced reduced employability/income or increased necessary expenses due to childcare or care for family during the pandemic
 - Experienced inability to afford moving expenses or secure other housing during the pandemic
 - Is at significant risk of suffering severe illness/death from COVID-19 due to age (over 65), disability, or underlying medical condition
- Tenant must sign and submit a sworn declaration to Landlord to seek this protection
- Protections not applicable to Tenants who are significantly interfering with other Tenants' rights or who pose a substantial safety hazard to others

Illegal Evictions

- It is unlawful for a Landlord to evict or attempt to evict a Tenant by:
 - Using/threatening force
 - Interfering/intending to interfere with or disturb the comfort, repose, peace or quiet of Tenant to provoke tenant to move
 - Preventing/intending to prevent Tenant's occupancy by methods such as removing Tenant's possessions, removing door to premises, rendering locks inoperable or changing the locks
